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Abstract: Free Drug Cell working in the Government Hospital, Ernakulum is initiated and operated by the Department of Social Work, Rajagiri college of Social Sciences, Ernakulum, Kerala. More than one lakh people are benefitting from this cell every year. The author was the coordinator of this departmental activity. This paper explains the operations and objectives of the free drug cell. This paper may act as baseline document for similar initiatives across globe, especially in developing and undeveloped countries.

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INTRODUCTION:

The free drug cell is started by the Social Work Students Association of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (SWARAJ) .The project was launched at the General Hospital after the students found hundreds of poor patients suffering in pain unable to afford the costly medicines. Their further enquiry in this subject led them to the awareness that huge quantities of sample drugs were lying unused in various hospitals in the district. Students collected these samples from doctors and got permission from the general hospital authorities to start a distribution center within the hospital premises. They started to distribute medicine to needy people. This humble initiative is now known as Rajagiri Free Drug Cell. Mahatma Gandhi says all children should grow up as citizens in a new social order, based on Co-operative work and with the understanding of their rights, responsibilities and obligations in such a society. These students are trying to practice. The rest of the paper explains the operations in detail.

RAJAGIRI- A LIVING EXAMPLE OF SOCIAL COMMITMENT OF ACADEMIC COMMUNITY

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences together with its sister educational institutions, owes its existence to the CMI(Carmelites of Mary Immaculate) fathers, founded in 19th century by Blessed Chavara Kuriakose. - Rajagiri Family Counseling Centre (FCC) works to strengthen the social fabric of the locality by preventing families from breaking up and promoting harmony in the family.
- Rajagiri Legal Aid Cell involves in activities including free legal aid, literacy classes and legal awareness seminars.
- **Childline** provides 24-hour free phone emergency and outreach service for children in difficult circumstances.
- Aditya- The Solar Shop promotes the use of solar devices through sales and service.
- Centre for Women's Studies and Development helps in promotion, development
 and dissemination of knowledge, related to the evolution of women's role in the
 society.
- Indian Council of Social Welfare (ICSW)- Kerala State is involved in the scrutiny of inter country adoptions and guardianship applications.
- RajagiriOutREACH (Rajagiri Educational Alternative and Community Health) Service Society (ROSS) is the umbrella organisition of RCDS (Rajagiri Community Development Scheme) CHCRE (Centre for Health Care Research and Education) and FDC (Free Drug Cell).

SWARAJ

Social Work students Association or Rajagiri (SWARAJ) the student association of school of social work conducts regular programmes spreading awareness, taking up community projects and several service initiatives to help students get exposure, attitude and experience in their professional fields. Every Tuesday afternoon is set apart for SWARAJ activities.

RAJAGIRI FREE DRUG CELL PROJECT

Rajagiri Free Drug Cell is a project launched in 1995 by the Department of Social Work, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. Kalamassery. This humble initiative came from the students association of the Department- Social Work Students Association of Rajagiri (SWARAJ). The field work exposure of Social Work Students at various government hospitals came as an inspiration to launch the project. During the fieldwork the students shockingly found that while scores of poor patients are writhing in pain, as they cannot afford costly medicine, heaps of sample drugs are lying unused in various hospitals. This free drug cell project aims to create a working arrangement to divert the surplus sample medicines and other available drug sources to the poor patients in these hospitals. The distribution of drugs which forms an essential service was meant to be only a starting point. It is our long cherished dream to provide every possible services to the poor patients at the Government General Hospital Emakulam. It is meant to grow and branch out in other areas like- health education of the community through campaigns, finding sponsorships for hospital's general welfare, rehabilitation services for the patients, campaigns for blood donation and eye donation, counseling, care of the by-standers etc.

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VISION OF THE PROJECT

To build up a service system which would adequately compliment the work of the medical professionals, by teaming up with them in providing holistic health care services to the poor and the needy patients of Ernakulam Government General Hospital

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

- Provide free medicines to the needy patients.
- Provide counseling services and render proper psychological support to the needy.
- Prepare psycho-social evaluation and assessment of the patients.
- Create awareness among more people about the services of the free drug cell.
- Network with different Departments of the Hospital as well as other external agencies.
- Provide Services and support to Heath Care providers.
- Establish a Department of social work in the Hospital.

CHILD /ADOLESCENT GUIDANCE CENTRE

Child /Adolescent Guidance Centre is an expansion of the Free Drug Cell Project at Ernakulam General Hospital. The necessity for the project was recognized by the Social Work students while initiating campaigns against the ill effects of Pan Masala in various

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schools of Ernakulam District. They found that around 24.5 % of the students below 16 years of age are addicted to drugs. And thus with the initiative of the students, this centre started its functioning from April 7th 2005.

OBJECTIVES OF CHILD /ADOLESCENT GUIDANCE CENTRE

- Assist the children to adjust with the inevitable changes (Physical, emotional, psychological) in their developmental span.
- Do Specific interventions for children with learning disabilities
- Execute therapeutic interventions in children with substance abuse
- Help the children with mental disabilities
- Enhance and promote rehabilitation of children with problems
- Referral services.
- Supplement the parents with knowledge and practical tips for the behavior development of children.
